

Jamestown in Minecraft Edu

Background: You have been studying Jamestown and its place in history as the first permanent English settlement in America. You have studied why and where the colony was built, what was used to build the fort, how the buildings were constructed, and what kind of tools were used.

Challenge: You have just landed on the coast of what will one day be Virginia. This is a strange land, completely unlike your home of England. There are strange animals and strange people who do not speak your language. You have come seeking your fortune. But before you can do anything you must build a place to live and work that will provide shelter and safety. You will be spawned aboard a ship. You must depart the ship, get into a boat, and row to shore together with your group. When you debark the ship look for the V-Shape between 2 hills. Aim for that. Row across the lagoon and look for the chest under a tree. You have been provided with some tools, string, seeds, and a few torches to help you get started.

Once there, design and build the settlement so that it resembles the first Jamestown settlement (see pictures). Your buildings should represent the original design of the fort. There should be room inside for appropriate buildings as well as the tools and other belongings the settlers used in their day-to-day life. The settlers elected their leader, and you should do the same.

Criteria:

- Represent the design of the original fort.
- Contain buildings inside the fort appropriate to the first settlement.
- Have tools and other belongings that settlers would have used in their day to day life.
- Use only materials and tools available to early settlers.

Materials: (May only use materials available to early settlers)

- Wood
 - Pine
 - Birch
 - Spruce
 - Oak
- Stone
- Iron
- Seeds
- String
- Dirt
- Sand

Tools:

- Shovel
- Pickaxe
- Hoe

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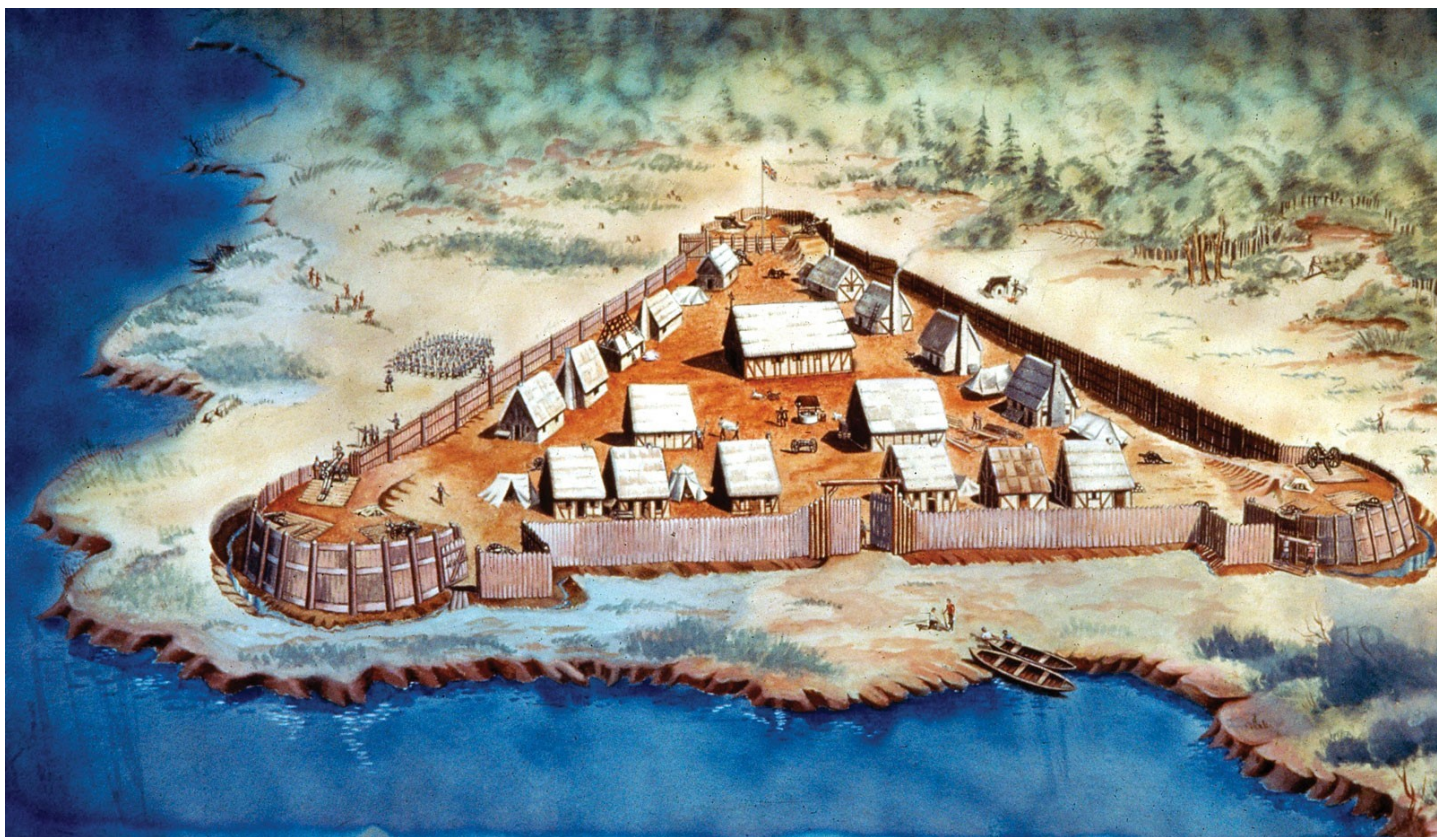


Oral Presentation:
